Composer, conductor, singer, and pianist Julius Eastman and his work *Stay On It* are highlighted in this Black Composer Showcase video. **Ryan Dohoney**, associate professor of musicology, discusses Eastman's life and role in New York's avant-garde music scene from the 1970s through Eastman's death in 1990. **Alan Pierson**, co-director of the Contemporary Music Ensemble, details the work of Bienen students in reconstructing *Stay On It* for their May 2022 Northwestern performance. Additionally, Eastman's controversial 1980 visit to Northwestern University is recalled, which included student protests leading up to the performance in Pick-Staiger Concert Hall.
